Monitoring Wildlife Update

There are currently **46** people participating in the Road Watch Project.

A total of **460** observations have been entered using the mapping tool. Sightings include:

Big horn sheep	80
Cougar	2
Wolf	3
Grizzly bear	1
Black Bear	3
Elk	30
Mule deer	209
White-tailed deer	57
Deer	46
Moose	23
Coyote	6
