Monitoring Wildlife Update

There are currently **40** people participating in the Road Watch Project.

A total of **371** observations have been entered using the mapping tool. Sightings include:

Big horn sheep	72
Cougar	1
Wolf	2
Grizzly bear	1
Black Bear	3
Elk	30
Mule deer	168
White-tailed deer	50
Deer	30
Moose	13
Coyote	1

A selection of the locations are displayed on the map below. Each point represents one event and does not indicate group size.
